With her remarkable achievements in mind, it is fitting that in September 2020, Conway Regional joined an esteemed group of hospitals known for nursing excellence by achieving Magnet® recognition from the American Nurses Credentialing Center. To achieve this designation in the Year of Nurse is incredibly special for our team members who provide the comprehensive care our patients deserve. We are blessed to have a medical staff who is engaged in our community and works in unity to ensure the highest quality care for our patients and their families.




When COVID-19 reached Arkansas on March 11, 2020, our team answered the call to provide high-quality, compassionate care to the communities we serve in the midst of an unprecedented global pandemic. Through innovation, collaboration, and resilience, our team ran into the challenges presented by COVID-19 to meet the health care needs of our community.

We remained mission-focused throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. Our team has continued to provide services to meet the ever-changing health care needs of our community. From COVID-19 testing, to telemedicine appointments, to caring for patients with COVID-19, our team expanded and adapted operations to meet the community's needs every step of the way.





Here are some of the ways our team responded to COVID-19 in 2020:

On March 13, approximately 48 hours after the first reported case in Arkansas, we opened one of the first drive-thru testing sites in the state.

On March 18, we began offering expansive telemedicine services to ensure patients had safe access to a health care provider.


On March 29, we opened a call center to answer questions about COVID-19, screening, testing, and access to care.

We expanded inpatient operations to accomodate the surge in COVID-19 inpatient hospitalizations by:

- Shifting units to expand from 14 critical care beds to 44
- Utilizing the Conway Regional Rehabilitation Hospital for the first time in our history for low acuity, non-critical, non-COVID patients



At the peak, Conway Regional had three COVID-19 units totaling 44 critical care beds. Construction was involved to meet proper COVID-19 isolation protocols.

We created content to provide information to our community across our social media platforms – including multiple educational campaigns (Stay Home AR, Don't Put Your Healthcare on Hold, COVID Safe, and more) and interviews with trusted providers.

We partnered with our community for contact tracing, testing, and education through the COVID Testing Consortia, Education Partnership with Hendrix College, Central Baptist College, and University of Central Arkansas and the Conway COVID-19 Vaccine Taskforce.

On December 16, we received an initial allotment of vaccine from the Arkansas Department of Health to distribute to frontline healthcare workers – Suzanne Harris, RN, received the first dose at Conway Regional.

On December 17, we began distributing vaccines in our community to eligible groups following the state's phase vaccine distribution plan.



One Team. One Promise.

Maintaining employee engagement and well-being is a pillar of our work culture at Conway and our cultural values Regional, foundational to our COVID-19 response efforts. While we worked as a team to care for our community, we also identified ways we could care for one another. Early in the pandemic, a new Staff Wellness Committee was formed and worked together to identify ways our organization could alleviate burdens, provide assistance, and support fellow team members.

Here are some of the ways we were able to care for our teammates:

- Complimentary meals from the cafeteria
- Take home meals for families at a discounted rate
- Relaxation room with massage chairs, dimmed lighting, and snacks
- Established a daycare at our Health and Fitness Center for employees to use for childcare at no cost

At the beginning of the pandemic, there was little known about the disease and how it was spread, which led the Arkansas Department of Health to temporarily suspend elective surgeries. The decision impacted many team members who were temporarily displaced and unable to work as a result of the directive. Executive leadership made it a priority to "redeploy" instead of "un-employ" team members affected by public health quidance.



Maintaining staff well-being is a pillar of our culture, and those values were central to our COVID-19 response such as our staff relaxation lounge.

Conway Regional created a resource pool for employees who wanted or needed to work. These team members were able to help with other tasks throughout the health system – such as screening employees, patients and visitors at our entrances, delivering meals, or assisting our environmental services team.

Conway Regional also implemented a remote work policy. Following Arkansas' first case, many Conway Regional employees who could work without being onsite began working remotely. Information Systems utilized a secure login platform to allow employees to access the hospital's systems and applications. Additionally, Microsoft's 365 platform, including Microsoft Teams, and Zoom video conferencing, became staple tools used to keep the organization connected. The implementation and utilization of a telecommuting policy allowed Conway Regional to continue to operate and provide

healthcare services during the pandemic, simultaneously providing work options for employees that protected their health and safety.

The Staff Wellness Committee continues to meet to identify ways we can support one another as we continue to provide care to our community throughout this pandemic.





TOWN HALLS

As Conway Regional continues to grow and expand, employee engagement and culture remain areas of focus and strength for the organization. Through quarterly Town Halls, employees and volunteers receive information about upcoming plans and policy changes directly from hospital leadership.

Employees are given the opportunity to ask questions and give feedback directly to leadership in an open forum format.

In 2020, our Town Halls were affected by COVID-19. After the January Town Hall, we changed to a virtual format in order to



adhere to state guidance on social distancing. In October, we also held two virtual Q&A meetings to give employees the opportunity to interact with leadership, ask questions, and share feedback.

EMPLOYEE WELLNESS

Despite the challenges of 2020, the health system continued to grow the employee wellness program and extended coaching benefits to spouses of employees on the health plan. The addition of spouses created the opportunity to increase the impact of the Wellness Team on the health and well-being of the health system's most valuable resources – our employees.

During the 2019 – 2020 coaching year, 50% of the employees that qualified for coaching improved their health significantly enough to reduce the amount of required coaching or to no longer require coaching based on health metrics. A large portion of this change is attributed to the health coaching provided by certified lifestyle coaches employed by the Conway Regional Wellness and Diabetes Education department.



For nearly 100 years, Conway Regional has provided high-quality, compassionate health care to the communities we serve. During that time, the communities have grown in population and changed to meet the needs of their residents. To reflect the partnership and interconnection of the health system and the local communities, Conway Regional launched the "We're Growing Together" campaign in 2019 which emphasizes the expansion of the health system's facilities, service lines, medical staff, and employees, mirroring the growth of our seven-county service area.

As part of Growing Together, a \$60 million capital investment project is currently underway, expanding and enhancing services throughout Conway Regional Health System, impacting 19 distinct areas of the health system.

In 2020, we completed several projects as part of this capital investment, including our new medical office building on the medical center campus and the expansion of the Conway Regional Greenbrier Family Medicine and Greenbrier Therapy clinics. Other notable elements of the capital investment project include a new pharmacy and expanded lab space, along with a new and expanded critical care unit. The first step of the project featured the renovation of the Conway Regional Health and Fitness Center which was completed in the winter of 2018.

MEDICAL OFFICE BUILDING

On September 9, 2020, Conway Regional celebrated the grand opening of our new, three-story medical office building just one year after the official groundbreaking located at the northeast corner of the hospital campus. It is the first new building on the campus in 18 years.

The 42,530 square-foot building houses the Conway OB-GYN Clinic on the third floor. This move combined their two previous locations into one, bringing together Andrew Cole, MD, Carole Jackson, MD, Phillip Gullic, MD, Keitha Holland, MD, Lauren Nolen, MD, and Katie Boyd, APRN, in one facility.

We are grateful to Cromwell Architects Engineers for designing the building, and Conway-based Nabholz Construction for serving as the general contractor.







Greenbrier Family Medicine Facility Expansion

Conway Regional Health System began building a new facility for the Conway Regional Greenbrier Family Medicine and Greenbrier Therapy clinics in February of 2020 to accommodate the need for an expansion of services in the growing Greenbrier area. Conway Regional Greenbrier Family Medicine welcomed the first patients to the new location on November 23, 2020.



Established in 1995, Greenbrier Family Medicine's medical staff includes James Fulmer, MD, Kristy Roberts, DO, Jarrod Jerry, APRN, Lauren Blansett, APRN, and Misty Birdwell, APRN. The clinic also provides care to patients outside Greenbrier's city limits, with many patients living in Clinton, Heber Springs, and Quitman.

The new building accommodates existing services, allowing providers to streamline care, while also allowing for the addition of new services. There is a dedicated area for specialists that includes a physician's office, nurses' desk, three exam rooms, and an extra procedure room. Currently,

orthopedic surgeons from Conway Orthopedics and Sports Medicine Center visit the clinic to see patients.

The new space allows for the relocation of Conway Regional Therapy Services - Greenbrier as well. The therapy team specializes in physical and occupational therapy for pre- and post-surgical conditions, such as rotator cuff, knee arthroplasty, and hip replacement.








As a community-based hospital, partnerships make our community successful and our organization stronger. In partnership with Hendrix College, Conway Regional Health System opened a family medical clinic with expanded hours on July 6, 2020. Conway Regional Hendrix Medical Clinic is available to meet the primary care needs of Conway residents as well as the Hendrix community. The clinic's medical staff includes Allison Wilson, APRN, Necie Reed, APRN, Katie Deacon, APRN, and Samantha Primm, PA. The new clinic has four exam rooms, x-ray and laboratory services, and a procedure room.

ADULT PSYCHIATRIC

Conway Regional was proud to expand access to mental health care in our community with the addition of our Adult Psychiatric unit. Adult Psychiatric services focus on providing a holistic approach to adult behavioral health treatment while providing expert psychiatric care in a safe environment that allows for the healing of the mind, body, and spirit.

The Adult Psychiatric team includes psychiatrists, licensed mental health counselors, and psychiatric nurses. Working collaboratively, the team views patient involvement as a vital part of the treatment plan, taking time to listen, earn trust, and build confidence to help patients be prepared for long term success.

CORPORATE WELLNESS

As the community continues to grow and the number of employers in the area increases, Conway Regional has placed an emphasis on providing healthcare services at workplaces throughout the region. By providing these services onsite, it allows employees to participate in health care services without having to leave the office, increasing productivity and convenience.

In 2020, the health system performed flu shot clinics for Cromwell Architects, Acxiom, the University of Central Arkansas, Tokusen, and the employees of Faulkner County. In total, over 1,000 flu shots were provided. Additionally, Conway Regional provided Health and Heart Wellness Checks to corporate partners and for members of the community.



Conway Regional welcomed Conway Orthopedic & Sports Medicine Center (COSMC) into the health system at the beginning of 2020. Since opening in 1998, COSMC's dedicated physicians and staff have built an extremely reputable practice.

Now, as part of the health system, Conway Regional manages and oversees all operations of the orthopedic center. At the time of acquisition, the center's physicians included Scott Smith, MD, Tod Ghormley, MD, Jay Howell, MD, Grant Bennett, MD, James Head, MD, Rick McCarron, MD, and Glenn McClendon, MD. The center remains within the existing facility located at 550 Club Lane in Conway.

The highly skilled providers at COSMC offer a wide range of services, including specialized care for the upper and lower extremities, minimally invasive surgeries of the knee and hand, total hip, knee, and shoulder replacements, sports medicine services.



On August 3, 2020, Conway Regional welcomed Renaissance Women's Center to the health system, with Conway Regional managing and overseeing all operations. The acquisition brought together two organizations committed to providing comprehensive women's services to north central Arkansas and the River Valley. The clinic medical staff includes Michael Wood, MD, Courtney Sick, MD, and Megan Moix, APRN. Kala Slayton, MD, also joined the practice in August.

The 9,350-square-foot Renaissance Women's Center is located at 2300 Robinson Ave., next door to the Conway Regional Medical Center campus. The center offers obstetrics, gynecological, and in-office procedures. Physicians continue to deliver babies and perform outpatient and inpatient surgical services at Conway Regional Medical Center.

Inaugural Class of Family Medicine Residents

After receiving Institutional Sponsorship in 2019, Conway Regional was proud to receive accreditation from the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) for our Family Medicine Residency program in January 2020.

The process of obtaining accreditation included evaluations of the health system as well as program personnel, faculty, institutional safety and quality metrics, curriculum, and the learning and working environment. After receiving accreditation, Conway Regional proudly inaugurated our first class of residents in July 2020.

Our program is training a generation of physicians who are critical thinkers, compassionate providers, skilled clinicians, and future leaders in medicine. The program offers additional opportunities for Arkansas medical students to complete their residency in state.

Residents are learning to practice as effective members of the health care system through multi-disciplinary team-based care in the inpatient and ambulatory settings. We are encouraging innovation while incorporating traditional family medicine, minor surgeries, obstetrical/gynecological care, and pediatrics into a dynamic educational process. Residents conduct their clinical rotation training at Conway Regional Medical Center, Conway Medical Group clinic, and Arkansas Children's Hospital.

EMPLOYEE GIVING CAMPAIGN

2020 reflected our largest employee giving campaign to date with 807 employees, staff, volunteers, and physicians pledging over \$91,836 to support Conway Regional's programs and services that benefit our patients, co-workers, and community.

TRIBUTE TREE

For the first time in its history, the Conway Regional Tribute Tree was presented as a drive-thru event on the medical center campus, providing a fun and safe experience for families to enjoy. Proceeds from the event supported scholarships awarded by the Foundation to students pursuing a degree in a health-related field. Over 200 families participated and \$13,085 was raised.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Conway Regional Health Foundation awards scholarships to students in health-related fields on an annual basis. In 2020, the Foundation awarded 14 scholarships, totaling \$27,000.

ARKANSAS DUCK DERBY

The Conway Regional Health Foundation held the second annual Arkansas Duck Derby in January of 2020. With a focus on raising money for the Men's Health Initiative, the event consisted of a banquet with dinner, silent and live auctions, raffles, live entertainment, as well as a competitive hunt. Proceeds from the event totaled over \$140,000 and more than 800 people attended the banquet.



WALK TO REMEMBER

Conway Regional hosted the 13th annual Walk to Remember as a park and pray event on October 3. The Conway Regional Perinatal Bereavement program sponsors the Walk to Remember to help families remember babies lost at any stage of pregnancy through the first year of life. The event is dedicated to the late Mike Smyers and his wife, Jeanne, who helped develop the bereavement program after their own family experienced loss. The event includes memorial balloon releases, testimonials, and reading the names of lost babies.

Additionally, the Conway Regional Health and Fitness Center offered a free six-week virtual training program to help keep participants on track. This training group offered encouragement and educational tips for both beginners and experienced runners.

CITY OF COLLEGES HALF MARATHON



Conway Regional Health System was the presenting sponsor for the inaugural City of Colleges Half Marathon. The run went virtual for 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, with event dates spanning from October 17 – December 14. The marathon is designed to offer a very unique opportunity in the running world, giving participants the ability to run through three college campuses—Hendrix College, University of Central Arkansas, and Central Baptist College. Conway Regional continues to serve as a resource for the community's health and wellness and is proud to support community events that provided a safe opportunity for participants to be physically active.



WAMPUS CAT CARE CLINIC

Conway Regional was proud to partner with Conway Public Schools to provide health care services to students and faculty in our education community. The Wampus Cat Care Clinic is a school-based health center that offers in-person visits as well as telemedicine services. The school district partnered with Conway Regional Medical Center to staff the center with an APRN who works in conjunction with the patients' primary care physicians. Services offered at the clinic include vaccines and immunizations, basic laboratory tests, care of illness and injury, sports and job physicals, and pediatric and adult wellness exams.

ATHLETIC TRAINING

Conway Regional believes in building strong community partnerships and works together with local physicians as part of the Conway Regional Comprehensive Sports Outreach Program (CSOP). This program provides on-site athletic training, education, emergency care, diagnosis, therapy, and rehabilitation of injuries and medical conditions. The program focuses on the needs of patients and student-athletes. We have athletic trainers, physical therapists, primary care physicians, emergency medicine physicians, cardiologists, orthopedists, and neurologists working together to help improve the health of our local athletes.

UACCM PARTNERSHIP FOR NURSING SCHOLARSHIPS

Conway Regional Health System and the University of Arkansas Community College at Morrilton announced a partnership on November 18, 2020 to aid with nurse recruitment and retention. The new UACCM Nursing Scholarship Program provides financial aid opportunities to students pursuing education in nursing with the UACCM Practical Nursing Program, giving them valuable clinical experience at Conway Regional, while addressing the critical nursing shortage facing healthcare organizations across the country.

The partnership awards up to six scholarships to licensed practical nurses (LPN) students over the next three years, with each recipient receiving \$2,500 in financial aid per semester, for three semesters.

Students are given the opportunity to work in pool float medical assistant positions at Conway Regional while completing the LPN program. This work opportunity allows the nursing students to learn the mission, vision, and values of Conway Regional, the health system's electronic medical records (EMR) system, Conway Regional policies and procedures, and become accustomed to the work culture before they finish school.

UCA PARTNERSHIP FOR CLINICAL EXCELLENCE

Conway Regional Health System and the University of Central Arkansas are proud to work together on the Partnership for Clinical Excellence. This partnership works to address the national nursing shortage at the local level by offering scholarships to UCA School of Nursing students in their junior or senior year. This program is mutually beneficial to Conway Regional and the BSN nursing students at the University of Central Arkansas. Conway Regional Health System and the Conway Regional Health Foundation provide financial support to qualified students who enroll in and graduate from the UCA BSN program with the intention of hiring such graduates at Conway Regional. In 2020, eight recipients received a total of \$40,000 in scholarships.

Pastoral Alliance

Conway Regional's partnership with local pastors is essential to providing support and increasing comfort levels for clergy in the healthcare setting. This alliance creates the opportunity for the health system and local pastors to communicate regularly about policies, best practices, and provide avenues for general feedback. During the quarterly meetings, pastors are provided with education on new health system services and offerings that may be beneficial to their congregations, as well as logistical information such as parking, visiting hours, and cafeteria discounts. Conway Regional also used the alliance meetings as another opportunity to provide COVID-19 education and information that was shared among local congregations.

Magnet® Recognition

On September 15, 2020, Conway Regional Medical Center was thrilled to receive Magnet® designation from the American Nursing Credentialing Center (ANCC). Magnet recognition is the gold standard for nursing excellence and only 8% of hospitals nationwide achieve Magnet Recognition status. Conway Regional was the third hospital in Arkansas—and the first outside of Little Rock—to receive the recognition and honor.

The ANCC distinguishes organizations who meet rigorous standards for nursing excellence. Hospitals achieve Magnet Recognition for quality patient care and innovations in professional nursing practice, and it is considered the highest recognition for a hospital nursing department.

This designation was achieved through a rigorous application process which began in April 2018. The medical center was surveyed by the ANCC in a comprehensive two-day site visit in July of 2020. Conway Regional team members were observed and assessed, and patients, family members, and staff were encouraged to submit comments and feedback to the Magnet® Recognition Program office.

Research demonstrates that this recognition provides specific benefits to health care organizations and their communities, such as:

- Higher patient satisfaction with nurse communication, availability of help, and receipt of discharge information
- Lower risk of 30-day mortality and lower failure to rescue rates
- Higher job satisfaction among nurses
- Lower nurse reports of intentions to leave their positions

Congratulations to our team for earning this recognition that is a true testament to the quality of care provided to the communities we serve.
