- 14% of patients struggle to afford utilities
- 18.6% of Arkansans are impacted by food insecurity
- 1 in 4 patients are unable to afford the cost of medication or equipment resulting in readmission to the hospital
- Limited transportation affects access to medical care

Since its launch in June 2024, the Health Disparity Fund has impacted 102 families.

The Conway Regional Health Disparity Fund aims to support patients who face significant financial and personal challenges. Beyond medical needs, patients often struggle with housing, food insecurity, and medication costs.

71 patients received essential medication support

3 homeless patients were provided hotel stays for their recoveryMore than 30 patients received meals ensuring adequate nutrition during recovery

FUNDING THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY

Restore, the new medical detox unit, fully funded by philanthropy, will address critical needs in Faulkner County and the broader Arkansas community. Serving an estimated 419 patients annually, the unit will offer 24-hour admissions to medically stabilize individuals and support their transition to rehabilitation or mental health treatment.

Only 21 medical detox facilities in Arkansas
Only 9 offer inpatient services
No other facility offers 24-hour admission

This unit is a testament to what is possible when a community comes together to support those in need. Thanks to philanthropy and strong partnerships, individuals struggling with addiction have immediate access to the medical care they need to detox safely and transition into long-term treatment. Conway Regional is committed to saving lives by providing this need in our community's health and well-being.





MOBILE HEALTH UNIT

Funded in part by the Arkansas Duck Derby, the Conway Regional Mobile Health Unit will increase access to health care in rural areas across Central Arkansas. Designed to meet the unique needs of each community it serves, the unit is equipped with two exam rooms, a lab, triage and intake area, a wheelchair-accessible entrance, and a restroom. This mobile resource allows Conway Regional to deliver high-quality, patient-centered care directly to underserved populations, removing barriers and promoting healthier communities.

SUPPORTING STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS



Conway Regional Health Foundation awarded **\$89,500** in scholarships to **39 students** pursuing a health related career.
